Title of Report	HM The Queen, Platinum Jubilee, 'The Queen's Green Canopy'
Summary	To discuss ordering trees to support this initiative for planting at various locations in the village.
Recommendation	To consider supporting the planting of new trees as part of HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations and volunteers for watering the new trees be identified before any order is placed.
Reasons for the Recommendation	To increase and support biodiversity in the village if there are suitable locations.
Impact on Budget	The trees are free of charge from the Woodland Trust, but there will be ongoing future maintenance. Some compost etc. may be needed too.
Risks	None
Background	<p>Melissa Zuydam, a resident of Adderbury, has suggested that the Parish Council obtains the three species on offer from 'The Queen's Green Canopy.' They are Crab Apple, Rowan (Mountain Ash) and Hazel.</p> <p>The following locations have been suggested:</p> <p>Lucy Plackett Playing Field - bottom of field, five trees Oxford Road - outside Red Lion – two trees The Rise - precise location tbc - five trees Croft Lane - next to Squires, two trees Squires Hairdressers - on right, one tree Kemps Road - corner by Silent Soldier – one tree</p> <p>It was also suggested that the triangle outside of the Primary School could be utilised as a wildflower area and the School might be interested in collaborating.</p>
Supporting documents; advice, reports etc should always be attached to the report and listed here	The Parish Council has previously obtained trees from the Woodland Trust and these are planted in the amenity area on Banbury Road, next to Vera Wood Close.
